

**Start of Official Canvass for the
November 6, 2012 General Election**

November 17, 2012, 9:00 a.m.

Chairman Tim Rudd called the Meeting to order at 9:05 a.m. Rick Combs led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Tim Rudd, Dave Lane, Rick Combs, and Paul Campbell. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

OTHER ATTENDEES: Keith Corman – SOS Liaison

TEST DECK:

Rick Combs and Dave Lane observed Jackie Smith run the Test Deck thru the 650 scanner. Tim and Dave compared the results with the previous Test Deck results and found them to match and that the ballot scanner was counting accurately.

2012-107 – Paul Campbell made the motion to accept the Results of the Test Deck. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

2012-108 – Rick Combs made the motion to instruct the office staff to proceed with the Official Canvass, per Board Policy in the Election Administration Plan. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

VALID ABSENTEE BALLOTS -to be added to the count

Director Miller reviewed the breakdown of the Valid Absentee Ballots.

118 – valid postmarks of November 5, 2012 or before

12 – 11S forms completed and returned

5 – uncounted ballots from election night

3 – duplicated needs updated and counted

2 – needs updated and counted

35 – UOCAVA ballots

9 – FWABS ballots

184 – Total Additional Valid Absentee Ballots

2012-109 – Rick Combs made the motion to accept the 184 additional Absentee Ballots that the staff has identified as valid and add them to the count. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Invalid Absentee Ballots:

Judy reviewed the Invalid Absentee Ballots with the Board.

78 – invalid postmarks-postmarked November 6, 2012 or later

14 – undeliverable ballots

30 – refusals to vote from nursing homes

2 – absentees returned due to moving out of state or county

1 – no secrecy envelope (received November 6, 2012)

1 – no stub on ballot

1 – ballot received from polling place

30 – secrecy envelopes incomplete/missing information (11S Forms/letters sent to each)

2 – FWAB's no write-in ballot enclosed/declaration/affirmation statement missing

159 – Total Invalid Absentee Ballots

2012-110 – Paul Campbell made the motion to reject the 159 Absentee Ballots that the staff has identified as invalid and should not be counted. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Judy advised the Board of 25 absentee ballots with questionable postmarks that require Board determination.

Of the 25 absentee ballots with questionable postmarks to be determined by the Board, they found 3 to be valid and 22 to be invalid.

2012-111 – Rick Combs made the motion to accept the 3 ballots that the Board determined to be valid and add them to the count. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”

2012-112 – Paul Campbell made the motion to reject the 22 ballots that the Board determined to be invalid because of the postmarks and note that they should not be counted. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

APPROVAL OF BILLS:

2012-113 – Dave Lane made the motion to accept and pay the bills through November 17, 2012. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon discussion, Paul inquired about the entry for the threshold for Ohio Twp and janitorial pay. Mike explained that we had to purchase a threshold for the outside of the building to make the entry ADA compliant. Judy and Mike explained the janitorial fee is to pay the set up people at each of the polling locations (for the 200 precincts). Rick inquired about the ES&S entry and yard signs. Judy explained that is for the election support/contract with ES&S, and the yard signs are for signs at every polling location stating-no campaigning beyond the flags and polling location banners. Rick also asked about the entries to the Clermont Sun. Judy stated it was for the legal notices and proclamation, required by code, this cost, and the cost of ES&S is charged back to each entity. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Judy asked the Board if the time of the meeting on Tuesday could be changed to 9:00 a.m. instead of 10:00 a.m. The Board agreed to change the time to 9:00 a.m.

2012-114 – Rick Combs made a motion for the Board to go into Recess and Reconvene on Tuesday, November 20, 2012 at 9:00 a.m. to proceed with the review of the Provisional Ballots and continue with the Canvass, and to conduct any other business deemed necessary by the Board. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

At 10:10 a.m., the Chairman stated the Board will stand in Recess.
The Board went back in Session at 10:11 a.m.

Judy reported that an Election Day ballot (AA-B) was in the soiled/defaced envelope and needs to be duplicated and added to the count. Another Election Day ballot (in the emergency M100 slot envelope-AA-B) that was found in the blue supply bag also needs to be added to the count.

2012-115 – Paul Campbell made the motion to accept the two Amelia Village B Election Day ballots as identified by the staff and add them to the official count. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

At 10:31 a.m., the Chairman stated the Board will stand in Recess.

Reconvening of Official Canvass
November 20, 2012, 9:00 a.m.

At 9:01 a.m. the Board went back in Session and the Chairman called the meeting to order. Rick Combs led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Tim Rudd, Dave Lane, Rick Combs, and Paul Campbell. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

OTHER ATTENDEES: Bob Farrell entered the meeting at 1:00 p.m.

PROVISIONAL BALLOTS:

Valid Provisional Ballots:

Director Miller reported there were 3,258 provisional ballots cast in this election. There are 2,612 valid provisional ballots and 83 require Board determination.

1 – voted in wrong precinct due to poll worker error

2 – in different school district per auditor’s office/voter

80 – voted in the correct polling location but voted in the wrong precinct

83 – ballots for Board review

2012-116 – Paul Campbell made the motion to proceed with the provisional ballots that the staff has determined to be eligible, total being 2,695 and instruct the staff to duplicate the 83 ballots to the correct precinct. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

The Board will stand in Recess, while the staff is instructed to proceed.

The Board went back on the Record.

Judy reported on the invalid provisional ballots, she reminded the Board that no voter names are linked to the ballots.

Voter Referred to Prosecutor's Office:

She advised the Board that a voter was mailed (11-3), voted, and returned an absentee ballot (postmarked on 11-5, delivered on 11-6). This voter then went to the polls on Election Day and voted a provisional ballot. The envelopes were filled out correctly.

2012-117 – Dave Lane made the motion on the provisional ballot and absentee ballot, that the staff has determined that a voter voted twice, be sent to the Prosecutor's Office for further investigation. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted "yes".

Invalid Provisional Ballots:

There were 563 invalid Provisional Ballots.

- 1 – voted an absentee ballot & returned/voted a provisional ballot
- 19 – front of envelope not completed
- 14 – printed name not on the envelope
- 19 – did not sign envelope
- 19 – new address in another county
- 138 – wrong precinct-back of envelope not completed
- 63 – voted in the wrong polling location/precinct
- 290 – not registered in Ohio

563 – Invalid Provisional Ballots

2012-118 – Paul Campbell made the motion to reject the 563 Provisional Ballots that the staff has determined to be invalid. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted "yes".

Judy stated that the staff was opening the provisional envelopes. The Board will need to make determinations on those provisional ballots that require review.

At 9:40 a.m., the Chairman stated that the Board will stand in Recess until 1:00 p.m.

At 1:00 p.m., the Chairman called the Board back in order.

Other Attendees: Bob Farrell

Judy advised the Board that the Provisional Ballots were opened and scanned.

Judy reported that when an Election Day provisional envelope (UN-G) was opened, it was discovered that it contained the voted provisional ballot and a blank absentee ballot. The person was a regular voter that received an absentee ballot, that notation was printed on the signature line, and was required to vote a provisional ballot. This person wanted to vote at the polls, voted the provisional ballot, and then produced the un-voted absentee ballot. Judy checked with the SOS, and their opinion was that because one was a voted provisional and the other was an un-voted absentee ballot that the provisional ballot should be counted.

There were Absentee Ballots that required Board determinations. The Board made their determinations on three (3) Absentee Ballots that required review.

2012-119 – Rick Combs made the motion regarding the three (3) absentee ballots for Board review that: 1 was a non valid write-in, 1 was a double bubble for President Obama, and 1 was a true over vote. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

The Board reviewed Provisional Ballots the required Board determinations and instructed the staff for any duplication.

Dan Shebesta will return on November 26 to create the final totals and reports for Certification on November 27.

2012-120 – Rick Combs made the motion to instruct the Office Staff to proceed with the Official Canvass per Board Policy in the Election Administration Plan. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

At 1:27 p.m., the Chairman stated that the Board will stand in Recess until November 27, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. to complete final Canvass, and hold the Regular November Board Meeting.

Board Reconvenes
Certification and Regular Meeting
November 27, 2012, 10:00 a.m.

Chairman Tim Rudd called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. Rick Combs led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Tim Rudd, Dave Lane, Rick Combs, and Paul Campbell. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

OTHER ATTENDEES: Kristin Bednarski, Debbie Caudle, Michael Ashmore, Jill Grubb

TEST DECK:

Rick Combs and Dave Lane observed the final running of the Test Deck on the 650 scanner. Tim read the results from the original report while Dave checked the new report and found the results to match, and that the ballot scanner was counting accurately.

2012-121 – Paul Campbell made the motion to accept the Results of the Test Deck. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

CERTIFICATION OF THE NOVEMBER 6, 2012 GENERAL ELECTION:

Director Miller reported that the final number of valid provisional ballots was 2, 699. She reported that our office received, from the SOS (the ballot was sent to them), a provisional envelope with a ballot from the State of Washington. The Board decided that the ballot should be mailed back to the Washington Board of Elections.

She stated that everything balanced. Dan Shebesta was here yesterday and ran everything. She added the staff did an excellent job.

2012-122 – Dave Lane made the motion to accept and Certify the Results of the November 6, 2012 General Election. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon discussion, Paul inquired if anything should be noted. She stated that no results changed and no races merit an automatic recount. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Director Miller reported that we are ready to proceed with the Post Election Audit, unless someone requests a recount (deadline 12-3). The Board decided to open the Audit on December 4, 2012 at 9:00 a.m. and to Certify and hold the Regular Monthly Board Meeting on December 13, 2012 at 2:00 p.m. Three (3) races will be hand counted: 1) Presidential Race, 2) Supreme Court Justice, and 3) race to be determined at the meeting. We will also select the precincts to be hand counted at the meeting.

The Board entered into the Regular November Board Meeting

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

2012-123 – Rick Combs made the motion to accept the minutes from the October 19, 2012 Regular Board Meeting. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

APPROVAL OF BILLS:

2012-124 – Rick Combs made the motion to accept and pay the bills as of November 27, 2012. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

DIRECTOR’S REPORT:

Director Miller advised the Board Members that they must sign the Election Reports for the Secretary of State. The results will then be scanned and emailed to the SOS.

Judy reviewed the Budget with the Board. She stated we had a remaining balance in each category, and approximately \$82,714.36 available by the end of the year.

Judy advised the Board that the Bid on Ballots will be covered at the January 2013 meeting. We do not have a February Special Election and she will send out the bids for the January meeting. Paul knew that we sent out additional ballots (absentee) to some of the precincts and wondered if they were used. She stated that they were not. We instructed the poll workers to call the office and advise us when they were down to 50 ballots remaining.

Judy reported on the OAEI Conference, January 9-11, 2013 at the Hyatt Convention Center in Columbus. She would like to send from the staff, Edna Owens, Becky Rudd, Jackie Smith, and Terrie Latham as well as Paul, Dave, Rick, Judy and Mike.

Judy advised the Board that she and Mike each received a letter from Vince Faris (newly elected County Prosecutor) stating that he would like to meet with them. He has hired Ernie Ramos as his assistance. Mr. Faris did not indicate that there would be a change in our legal counsel (Mary Lynne Birck).

Judy has been paying the cable bill (\$25.30) for the office and is not going to continue paying for it. She asked the Board if they wanted to pay the bill to continue the service. Rick asked if we had the money in the budget and Mike stated that we would be able to cover the cost.

2012-125 – Paul Campbell made the motion for the Board to pay the cable bill for the BOE office. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, Paul Campbell “yes”, Dave Lane “yes”, Rick Combs “yes”, and Tim Rudd “no”.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR’S REPORT:

Deputy Director Keeley did not have a report.

RESOLUTIONS: None.




