

**Start of Official Canvass for the
November 4, 2014 General Election**

November 17, 2014 at 9:00 a.m.

Chairman Tim Rudd called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m. Rick Combs led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Tim Rudd, Dave Lane, Rick Combs, and Paul Campbell. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking record.

OTHER ATTENDEES: Mark Czarnik, Videographer for the OAEO and Steve Rabolt (County Administrator) who arrived at 10:10 a.m.

TEST DECK:

At 9:03 a.m. the Board went off the Record to run the Test Deck. Rick and Dave observed the Test Deck run thru the 650 scanner. Tim and Dave compared the results of the newly run Test Deck to the Control Sheet and found the results to match and that the computer was counting accurately.

At 9:15 a.m. the Board went back on the Record.

2014-110 – Paul Campbell made the motion to accept the results of the Test Deck. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS:

Director Miller reviewed the breakdown of the Absentee Ballots with the Board. She also advised them of a change in the instructions for review of the absentee ballots in Directive 2014-18. It states that if the Voters day and month of their birthdate on the Voters ID envelope matches the day and month in the statewide voter registration database it is considered to be complete (or) the voter has completed all other required information on the ID Envelope (but fails to include their date of birth) the Board may accept it with at least 3 votes from the Board Members.

There were 14,601 absentee ballots requested, 13,028 were received and counted thru Election Day and 1,573 were not returned.

The Board reviewed the absentee ballots that were returned after Election Day, November 4, 2014.

INVALID ABSENTEE BALLOTS

- 6 – No postmark
- 71 – Postmarked Election Day (November 4) or after
- 31 – Refused by nursing home voters/requested not voted
- 22 – No stub attached to the ballot
- 7 – No voter ID/Secrecy Envelope – voters were contacted

- 1 – POA signed – no POA (form 10-F & 10-G) on file at the BOE
- 5 – No proper identification on ID/Secrecy Envelope
- 2 – Multiple Problems (no ballot, no signature, DOB)
- 3 – Voter not a resident of the county
- 3 – Undeliverable
- 1 – Absentee Ballot returned to the polls on Election Day
- 1 – Postmark date determined by the Board to be late

Paul inquired if those Absentee Voters that were contacted regarding missing information had a chance to complete the information. Judy advised that they were properly notified and that while most of those voters did follow up and complete their information, some voters did not.

2014-111 – Rick Combs made the motion to reject the 153 Absentee Ballots reviewed by the Board and identified by the staff as “Invalid”. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

VALID ABSENTEE BALLOTS

- 13 – Date of Birth Missing (did not include the day & month – but included all other required information)
- 35 – Postmarked before Election Day and received within the 10 day period
- 17 – 11-S Forms completed and returned
- 5 – Valid UOCAVA’s

2014-112 – Paul Campbell made the motion to accept the 13 Absentee Ballots without a proper Date of Birth but containing all other required information as identified by the Board. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all 4 Members voted “yes”.

2014-113 – Rick Combs made the motion to accept the 57 additional Valid Absentee Ballots and add them to the count. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

PROVISIONAL BALLOTS:

Director Miller reviewed the Provisional Ballots with the Board.
The Board made determinations on the Provisional Ballots requiring Board review.

INVALID PROVISIONALS

- 1 – Person voted an Absentee ballot in Hamilton Cty and then voted a Provision Ballot in Clermont Cty
- 1 – No ID on Envelope
- 2 – New Address in Another County
- 11 – Voted Wrong Church (polling location)/Wrong Pew (precinct)
- 31 – Not Registered in Ohio

The Board discussed the person that voted in Hamilton County (absentee ballot) and Clermont County (provisional ballot). Paul asked if the invalidated provisional voters had a chance to get registered. Judy stated that we will mail those individuals a registration card to allow them to get properly registered.

2014-114 – Rick Combs made the motion to reject the 46 Provisional Ballots that should not be counted as identified by the staff. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

VALID PROVISIONALS

12 – Voted Right Church (polling location)/Wrong Pew (precinct) – Need to be duplicated to the proper precinct and added to the count
638 – Valid Provisional Ballots – no visible problems

2014-115 – Dave Lane made the motion to accept the 650 valid Provisional Ballots and add them to the count as identified by the staff. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

CURBSIDE VOTER

There was 1 ballot, from Owensville Village that was a curbside voter that did not get counted on Election Night.

2014-116 – Dave Lane made the motion to accept the curbside voter ballot from the Owensville Village precinct that was voted on November 4. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

Referral of Provisional Voter to the Prosecutor’s Office:

2014-117 – Dave Lane made the motion to send the information that we have on Charles N. Marsalis to the Prosecutor’s Office for further investigation regarding voting both an absentee ballot in Hamilton County and then cast a provisional ballot in Clermont County. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

2014-118 – Rick Combs made the motion to instruct the Office Staff to proceed with the Official Canvass. Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

At 10:10 a.m. the Board went off the Record for a five minute Recess
At 10:13 a.m. the Board went back on the Record.

Director Miller explained that Steve Rabolt (County Administrator) was asked to attend the meeting to discuss the financing of the potential purchase of Electronic Pollbooks. We are waiting to hear from the

Prosecutor's Office on whether or not we need to go out to bid for this purchase. We also need to determine how much it is going to cost and if there is money in the budget. The last quote was \$264,137. Judy stated that the County has appropriated up to \$400,000 for the purchase of the Electronic Pollbooks. Rick advised that he understands that there could be some grant money appropriated by the Ohio Legislature for this purchase. Further, that we could be reimbursed for this purchased within one year of the passed legislation. Administrator Rabolt stated that the Commissioners have appropriated \$400,000 for the purchase of Electronic Pollbooks for this year and it will roll over to next year which is a commitment from the Commissioners. The Board of Elections has the full support of the Commissioners if the Board decides to move forward with the purchase of the Electronic Pollbook. The Board of County Commissioners (BCC) will front the money for the purchase in 2015.

Director Miller advised that the next major concern is the upgrade of other Election Equipment. We don't believe that we need to go out to bid on these because it is an upgrade of the M100's and the 650 ballot scanners. We currently have three 650 scanners and thought about trading two of them for one 850 ballot scanner and keeping one 650 scanner. That would be a trade in of over \$122,000 and the cost would be \$1,028,000. ES&S does not have a lease program at this time, but they might finance in house. Administrator Rabolt stated that the County Commissioners have penciled in \$350,000 a year for the next four years for equipment replacement. The question to the Board is how they want to implement that; we can phase it in but not pay for it all at once.

The M100 and DS200 scanners are compatible so they would not all have to be replaced at one time. We may be able to do this in two or three phases.

Judy added there would be about a \$15,000 a year savings in the maintenance contract on the DS200's.

After the first year there will be a \$24,000 maintenance fee on the electronic poll book.

Rick suggested putting this on the table and sees what kind of options is available.

Tim stated that the BCC is committing \$750,000 for next year and then \$350,000 for each year after that and we need to break it down from there. He added that Mike and Judy need to decide what they want first; between the DS200 and 850 scanner. Judy stated that she would like to start training this summer on the Electronic Pollbooks for use in the November 2015 General Election and be ready for the March 2016 Primary Election.

There is also the Unity System (ballot definition) upgrade. This should be included in the usual maintenance but there will be a maintenance fee after the upgrade of about \$10,000 a year.

The Board also spoke to Administrator Rabolt regarding the employee raises. The Board agreed to give the staff a 3% raise and the BCC allowed for a 1.6% raise. The Board would like the BCC to give the staff the 1.4% difference. Steve stated the BCC has a meeting Wednesday to talk about raises, if any, will be available in 2015. Judy stated that a 3% raise for the entire staff was included in our 2014 & 2015 budget. She added that she and Mike would like this staff to meet the same levels as other offices regarding classifications and salary. Kathy Weaver and Chris Mehlman sent Judy and Mike a list of county employees with classifications and number of years employed. On average our staff is making two dollars an hour less. Steve stated that re-classifying employees is an ongoing process. He asked Judy and Mike to hold off until the January cycle.

Rick would like to see some adjustments especially for an organization that has outstanding service. He would also like to see a job audit.

Paul added that he has seen legislation for a 5% increase in Board Members salary. Tim stated that the papers said the Senate won't vote for it.

Before Administrator Rabolt left the meeting at 10:38 a.m. he added that the Electronic Pollbook is the way to go and it is cost effective.

APPROVAL OF BILLS:

2014-119 – Rick Combs made the motion to pay the bills received through November 17, with the exception of Poll Worker Payroll. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

2014-120 – Dave Lane made the motion to pay the Poll Workers \$91,495.00 (which include the conflicts of Tim Rudd). Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, Dave Lane – “yes”, Rick Combs – “yes”, Paul Campbell – “yes”, Tim Rudd – “abstain”.

2014-121 – Rick Combs made the motion to pay the Poll Workers \$130.00 (which include the conflicts of Paul Campbell). Dave Lane seconded the motion. Upon roll call, Rick Combs – “yes”, Dave Lane – “yes”, Paul Campbell – “abstain”, Tim Rudd – “yes”.

Judy advised the Board that we were reimbursed \$3,444.68 for ADA Training for our Precinct Election Officials (PEO’s). The check will be sent to the Auditor’s Office and placed in the General Fund.

2014-122 – At 10:42 a.m. Dave Lane made the motion to stand in Recess and Reconvene November 25, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. to complete the Official Canvass for the November 4, 2014 General Election. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon direction from the Chairman, all Members answered “aye”.

**Board Reconvenes
Certification and Regular Board Meeting
November 25, 2014 at 10:00 a.m.**

The Board Reconvened and was back in Session on November 25, 2014 at 10:02. Rick Combs led the Pledge of Allegiance. Board Members present were Tim Rudd, Paul Campbell, Rick Combs, and Dave Lane. Also present were Judy Miller – Director, Mike Keeley – Deputy Director, and Becky Rudd – Clerk taking Record.

OTHER ATTENDEES: None.

TEST DECK:

At 10:02 a.m. the Board went off the Record to run the Test Deck. The Test Deck was run on November 21, 2014 while Dan Shebesta (ES&S) was in the office. Tim and Dave compared the results of the newly run test deck to the control sheet and found the results to match and that the computer was counting accurately.

At 10:07 the Board went back on the Record.

2014-123 – Rick Combs made the motion to accept the results of the Test Deck. Paul Campbell seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

CERTIFICATION OF THE NOVEMBER 4, 2014 GENERAL ELECTION:

Director Miller advised the Board of three precincts that did not balance.

Union Township L1L- the voter put his ballot in the M100 and walked off. The machine started beeping. The ballot judge then pulled the ballot out and instead of putting the ballot in the M100 emergency slot the ballot was marked “Void” and put in the soiled/defaced envelope. It could not be determined which ballot it was since they wrote “Void” on the ballot and there was more than one such ballot in the envelope. The M100 count was one ballot short.

Bethel Village A and Miami Township Y- There is one more name in the clerks book and one more ballot pulled than what the reader read. The staff checked precincts within the polling location to see if the ballot was left at another precinct. We called the PEO’s and they do not recall anything odd. The voter may have walked off with the ballot...which they have been known to do in the past.

One curbside voter’s ballot needed to be added to the count in Owensville Village.

The total number of ballots cast was 51,522.

2014-124 – Paul Campbell made the motion to Certify the Results of the November 4, 2014 General Election. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

AUTOMATIC RECOUNT:

Judy stated that one Tax Levy qualified for an Automatic Recount. The Franklin Township Cemetery Levy had a one vote difference – For = 439, Against = 438.

Judy suggested that after the Certification of the Recount we start the Post Election Audit on the same day. The Recount was set for December 3, 2014 at 9:00 a.m.

Post Election Audit

Judy reviewed the the procedures for the Post Election Audit. Per the Directive we will count the top of the ticket race – Governor’s, Treasurer of State (random selection by the SOS) and a random selection of a countywide contested race – the only contested race is the Commissioners race.

The Board will Certify the Audit at the December 18, 2014 Regular Board Meeting at 2:00 p.m.

The Board entered the Regular Monthly Meeting

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

2014-125 – Dave Lane made the motion to accept the minutes from the October 23, 2014 Board Meeting. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

APPROVAL OF BILLS:

2014-126 – Dave Lane made the motion to accept and pay the bills. Rick Combs seconded the motion. Upon roll call, all Members voted “yes”.

DIRECTOR’S REPORT:

Director Miller reported that no entities filed for a February Special Election. She stated that there has been some interest in a May Special Election. Bids on Ballots will be at the January 2015 meeting. The OAEO Conference is January 14-16, 2015 in Columbus at the Hyatt. Judy, Mike and four staff will attend; Dave and Paul advised that they will also attend. The 2015 Candidates Handbook and Election Calendar issued by the Secretary of State are now posted on our website.

Rick asked where we are with the Election Equipment. Judy stated that she is waiting to hear from Mark Radkee (ES&S) to finish the letter to Ernie Ramos (Prosecutor’s Office). Ernie is also handling the referrals to the Prosecutor’s Office.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR’S REPORT:

Rick asked how the election equipment deployment went. Mike stated it went very well; the same personnel worked this election as did the last election. Kim Beard has developed a good working relationship with this crew and they did an outstanding job.

RESOLUTIONS: None.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: None


